Why Seek Treatment?

- 44 Million Americans experience some type of mental disorder every year.
- ❖ 79.4% of Americans aged 12 or older (27 million) are current users of illicit drugs.
- ❖ 40,393 people died of drug-induced causes and nearly 30,000 died of alcohol- induced causes in the U.S. in 2010.
- According to a 2013 study by the National Mental Health Association, untreated mental illness costs the United States a staggering \$200 Billion each year.

73% of women in treatment have suffered abuse by their partner

- ❖ 600,000 people are homeless on any given day; 25% -30 % of those homeless have a mental illness.
- ❖ Each year about 10 million adults enter U.S. jails; about 700,000 of these people may have a co-occurring disorder.
- Among Caucasians, druginduced death rates rose sharply after 1990 and surpassed deaths involving alcohol and firearms in 2001 and 2002, respectively.
- Among African-Americans, drug-induced deaths surpassed alcohol-induced deaths for the first time in 1999.
